

## **Curriculum Vitae, Vertr. Prof. Dr. Monika Schröttle**

**Dr. Monika Schröttle is project manager at the Institute for empirical sociological research (IfeS) at the University of Nürnberg and is currently substitute Professor for Gender Research at the Technical University of Dortmund, Germany. She is an expert in violence against women and violence prevalence research.**



From 2002 - 2004 she was project director for the first national large-scale German representative survey on violence against women, which was financed by the German Ministry for women and family affairs. The data of the study was published in 2004 and was further analysed for questions of risk factors, levels and types of violence, health impact and migration until 2009.

From 2008 – 2014 further large-scale studies were conducted on violence against women with disabilities as well as on discrimination.

With a background in political science and interdisciplinary violence research in women's and gender studies, Monika Schröttle focuses on the empirical analysis of violence in gender relations. Her doctoral thesis at the University of Giessen (1999) focused on the relationships between politics and violence in gender relations and here in particular on the extent, causes, and socio-political background of violence against women in intimate relationships in the former East Germany.

As a coordinator of CAHRV – Coordination Action on Human rights violations (see [www.cahrv.uni-osnabrueck.de](http://www.cahrv.uni-osnabrueck.de)), Monika Schröttle was coordinating an Expert-Subnetwork on Violence-Prevalence-Research in Europe together with Manuela Martinez. In cooperation with the French Projekt Partner INED she has furthermore conducted comparable studies on Violence against Migrant- und Non-Migrant Women in Germany and France and has published an international Reader on Violence against Migrant Women and Ethnicity in Europe in 2011 (together with Ravi Thiara and Stephanie Condon). For the Research Center of the German ministry of Health (Robert-Koch-Institute) Monika Schröttle has worked on a module on violence against women and men for the national German Health survey and published a reader on national and international research on health consequences of violence together with her colleagues of the Universities of Bielefeld and Osnabrück. Her newer quantitative studies at the Universities of Bielefeld and Nürnberg were concerned with violence and discrimination against disabled women and men.

Monika Schröttle was also part of the preparations for the international FRA-survey on violence against women in Europe and piloted the project as a country partner in 2011/2012. From 2013 to 2015 another international research project funded by Daphne was concerned with violence prevention and counselling for disabled women who were affected by violence.

Since 2012 Monika Schröttle is coordinator of the European research network on gender and violence ([www.engv.org](http://www.engv.org)). For the German ministry of women's and family affairs she has developed a monitoring concept for the long-time observation of gendered violence, its causes and consequences and the state reactions. Schröttle is now aiming to build up further networks for the international monitoring process on violence against women.
